**April 4, 2010 - Easter Sunday: Resurrection of the Lord**

**GOOD NEWS, we think!** A progress report about the future new Church:

A year and a half ago, we put on hold our plans for a new Church on the San Bernardino land, the 15.5 acres our Diocese gave us when we became a new parish in July, 2006. There were two reasons:

1. The San Bernardino land is in a very commercial location outside city limits, and many of you indicated that you wanted another site for your future monetary contributions.
2. The site is too small to include Sacred Heart Academy. Plans were to have it stay on the Olive campus and renovate the old buildings. But the cost of making those buildings safe for school use would be prohibitive; and the physical connection between parish and school would be cut.

With help from a great committee of people, we searched for a new site. In the Fall we asked Bishop Barnes for permission to purchase a different site which the building committee steering committee (BCSC) had identified as its first choice. Bishop graciously agreed to take back the San Bernardino land and give us cash for this purchase! In November we began negotiations. Last week contracts were completed and shortly we hope to be in escrow. Escrow is a period when the buyer, us, carefully checks out the land. Environmental tests are needed, ownership titles must be checked, we have to talk to the city about what they will require of us to hold the land and develop it, and so on, before we make a final commitment. And there also are "acts of God" that can prevent a purchase from being completed, such as the death of one of the 6 owners.

*So please pray with me that if God wants our future church here, everything will go well during this look and see phase.* The BCSC and I believe this is a great site. It will be accessible for both south side and north side residents, and as west Mentone housing develops over the next 20 years, our Church will end up in the middle of greater Redlands housing. In telling you where the location is, I trust you will share my anxiety during this due diligence phase but also my hope and exhilaration about the new possibility! The possible new location is 2 tracks of land, totaling almost 20 acres, at Lugonia and Dearborn.

### ***Sharing our Faith... Exodus 14: 14-15:1; Gospel of John 20: 1-9***

When I have "kept" Lent well, these precious "high holy days" of Triduum and Easter and the awe of the Paschal Mystery make a significant difference in my life.

Central to both the liturgical celebrations and the prayers of this season are powerful symbols which enrich our faith life these days: water, light, oil, bread and wine. In the years that I have been involved with initiation ministries, I have come to listen to and remember better the prayers of the Easter Vigil. I want to focus for now on the centrality of water in the Vigil as we prepare for the baptism of the Elect, and as we renew our own baptismal promises. In the proclamation from Exodus we hear how the waters of the sea saved the escaping people of Israel from the pursuing Egyptians. God's power in action!! In the prayers of blessing of the new baptismal water, we hear the recounting of the myriad of ways in which God has been with, protected, cared for and saved the Chosen People, from creation to crucifixion.

About twenty-seven years ago, those prayers were said over the waters with which our daughter Marie would be baptized that evening. What a perfect celebration! To know that grace and redemption have been offered to her, to each of us, brings me to tears at times. Because of her, I am more than ever aware of how intimately God's love and salvation are present in my life today. I often take water for granted, but in the Easter Vigil prayers and rites I see once again how God uses the simple things of daily life to let us know how passionate God is about each of us. As we witness the baptism of our Elect, I am in awe of God's continuing mercy and goodness. Each time during the Easter liturgies, when the sprinkling rite is used, each time we go to the font of new life and bless ourselves with this holy water, we can be renewed and reminded of God's great, tender and continuing love. The Paschal Mystery touches our lives each day; may we, each time we use water, recall with joy God's great gift of redemption.

**4 de Abril de 2010 - Domingo de Pascua de la Resurrección del Señor**

**BUENAS NOTICIAS, pensamos!**

Hace un año y medio atrás, dejamos en suspenso los planes para una nueva iglesia en la tierra de San Bernardino, los 15.5 hectáreas nuestra Diócesis nos dio cuando nos convertimos en una nueva parroquia en julio del 2006. Hay dos razones:

1. La tierra de San Bernardino se encuentra en una zona muy comercial fuera de los límites de la ciudad, y muchos de ustedes indicaron que querían otro sitio para sus futuras contribuciones monetarias.
2. El sitio es demasiado pequeño para incluir a la Academia del Sagrado Corazón. Planes iban a tener que permanecer en el campus de Olive y renovar los edificios antiguos. Pero el costo de hacer los edificios de seguridad para uso escolar sería prohibitivo, y la conexión física entre la parroquia y la escuela se reduciría.

Con la ayuda de un comité de la gente, hemos buscado un sitio nuevo. En el otoño se le pidió permiso al obispo Barnes para comprar un sitio diferente que el Comité de Creación de comité de dirección (BCSC) había identificado como su primera opción. El Obispo accedió amablemente a recuperar la tierra de San Bernardino y darnos dinero a cambio para esta compra! En noviembre se iniciaron las negociaciones. La semana pasada los contratos se terminaron y en breve esperamos estar en escrow. Escrow es un período en que el comprador, nosotros, verificamos que si queremos la propiedad. Pruebas ambientales son necesarios, los títulos de propiedad deben ser revisadas, tenemos que hablar a la ciudad sobre lo que exigirá de nosotros para mantener la tierra y su desarrollo, y así sucesivamente, antes de hacer un compromiso definitivo. Y también hay "actos de Dios" que pueden evitar la compra final, como la muerte de uno de los 6 propietarios.

Así que por favor oren conmigo en que si Dios quiere futuro de nuestra iglesia aquí, todo irá bien durante esta fase de observar y ver. El BCSC y yo creemos que este es un gran sitio. Será accesible tanto para los residentes al sur y al norte, y conforme la vivienda de Mentone aumente y se este desarrollando durante los próximos 20 años, nuestra Iglesia va a terminar en el medio de la vivienda mayor Redlands. Al informarles hoy de la localidad dónde está ubicado, sé que van a compartir mi ansiedad durante esta fase de diligencia, pero también mi esperanza y alegría acerca de la posibilidad de algo nuevo! La nueva ubicación posible es 2 pistas de tierra, un total de casi 20 hectáreas, en Lugonia y Dearborn.

**Compartiendo nuestra fe... Juan 13,1-15**

San Agustín nos enseña "La Iglesia tiene la necesidad de lavar los pies". ¿Qué piensa usted? La compañía de Simon Pedro, quien dijo "Señor, ¿tú lavarme a mí los pies?" Y, más "No me lavarás los pies jamás". ¡Y él fue el primer apóstol, el primer obispo de Roma! Pero la Iglesia—ustedes, los obispos, y yo, también el Santo Padre de Roma—nosotros tenemos la necesidad de lavar los pies, a cada uno de nosotros y de los demás, los pobres, los ricos, los aquí-nacidos y los inmigrantes, los jefes y los trabajadores, los de una cultura y los de otras.

¿Pero que significa lavar los pies? De nuevo, Jesús en sus propias palabras nos enseña "Porque les he dado ejemplo, para que también ustedes hagan como yo he hecho con ustedes". ¿Y cuál es este 'ejemplo' ya dado por Cristo a nosotros? Es el ejemplo de humildad, de obediencia, de sumisión y la aceptación de la voluntad de Dios. Esto fue Jesús, esto es Jesús, y somos sus seguidores, esto es para nosotros también "para que también ustedes hagan como yo he hecho con ustedes".

San Agustín, de nuevo diariamente nos lava los pies aquel que intercede por nosotros, es decir, endereza los caminos por los que se mueve nuestro espíritu, según lo confesamos en la oración dominical "perdona nuestras ofensas como también nosotros perdonamos a los que nos ofenden". Es en el perdón de las ofensas entre nosotros—entre esposo y esposa, o padres e hijos, u obispos y sacerdotes o anglos y latinos, o quizás—en que espiritualmente nos lavamos los pies. Sin este perdón personal, a nivel en realidad con su muerte en la cruz Él nos ha dado el perdón de pecados. Nosotros, en el perdón de ofensas cometidas por otros contra nosotros, podemos recibir el perdón de nuestros pecados. Esto es verdaderamente lavar los pies. ¿Quién ha ofendido a usted? ¡Perdone sus pecados! Si ellos le preguntan o no, porque cuando usted perdona a otro, lava el alma de él/ella, y también los pies. Éste será su secreto, y "tu Padre, que ve en lo secreto, te recompensará". **¿A quién le tienes que pedir perdón?**

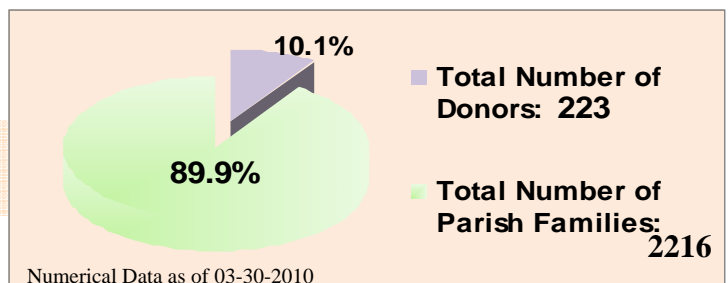

**Jesus summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny themselves, take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for my sake and that of the Gospel will save it."** (Mk 8: 34-35)

All this talk about dying, denying ourselves, giving rather than getting can be downright depressing. But Jesus was talking about a different kind of dying, a different kind of denying self, a different kind of giving.

He taught us that we were not made to bend inward, but rather to bend outward. Our life was not meant to be characterized by grasping, hoarding, focusing on self. As a matter of fact, that is precisely the kind of life that is depressing, unfulfilling. **I WAS MADE TO GIVE, SHARE, FOCUS ON OTHERS.**

Just as the star is made to shine, or a deer is made to run, I am made to be giving.

I "die" to one way of life - turning inward - and rise to a different way of life - turning outward to others. It is the only way to be happy. It's also the kind of giving Jesus was talking about.

If I live this kind of life, I will inherit more life than ever before.

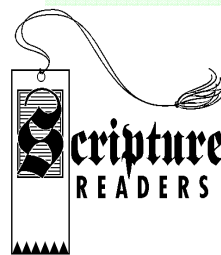
