**April 11, 2010 - Second Sunday of Easter**

**MYSTAGOGIA:** this Greek word is a period of time when the newly baptized Catholics from our Easter Vigil continue reflecting on the mysteries of our faith.

Mystery of faith: *"Let us proclaim the mystery of faith,"* our priest exhorts us right after the Consecration of each Mass. We respond with a sung response like "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again."

Mystery is not something that we cannot understand. Catholic Christianity has always valued the mind and insisted that we should probe our mysteries, trying to find new and more adequate ways of expressing and understanding our faith. That is why we keep revising our catechisms! Mystery, for us Catholics, means that after we have done our best to understand, we know there always is more to understand. Think of the image of the horizon. You walk toward it, but it is always ahead of you. Every word and thought we have of God and our mysteries of faith captures who and what God is for us but also fails to fully express the reality of God. A mystery is an inexhaustible truth. It is that which we get to explore eternally when we enter eternity! Mystery is why we gather each week at Eucharist: the same structure of Mass is a container for the mysteries of our faith. We ponder anew the meaning of the breaking of the bread for us, and the truths of our scriptures.

Let's use these weeks between Easter and Pentecost to talk about some of the mysteries of our faith! Next week let's look at the word "soul." What do we mean by that word? You might want to explore that in your family this week!

**MISTAGOGIA:** Es la palabra Griega para ese período de tiempo en el que los Católicos recién bautizados en nuestra Vigilia Pascual continúan meditando sobre los misterios de nuestra fe.

Misterio de fe: Diciendo *"Este es el misterio de nuestra fe"*, es la exhortación del sacerdote, en cada Misa, luego de terminar la Consagración. Respondemos cantando: "Cristo ha muerto, Cristo ha resucitado, Cristo vendrá de nuevo"

Misterio no es solamente algo que no podemos entender. La Cristiandad Católica ha valorado la mente y ha insistido que debemos examinar nuestros misterios, tratando de encontrar nuevas y más adecuadas maneras de expresar y entender nuestra fe. ¡Por eso revisamos periódicamente nuestros catechismos! Para nosotros los Católicos, misterio significa que sabemos que siempre quedará más material por aclarar, después de que nos hayamos esforzado por entender. Es como el horizonte: por más que caminemos en dirección a él, siempre permanece delante de nosotros. Cada palabra y cada pensamiento que tenemos acerca de Dios y de los misterios de nuestra fe, son referentes de nuestro concepto de Dios, pero no alcanzan a expresar la realidad de Dios. El misterio es una verdad insondable. ¡Es todo aquello que vamos a explorar eternamente cuando entremos en la eternidad! Misterio es la razón por la cual nos reunimos cada semana en la Eucaristía: la estructura misma de la Misa es un recipiente de los misterios de nuestra fe. Reflexionamos una y otra vez sobre el significado que tiene para nosotros el partir del pan y las verdades de nuestras Escrituras.

¡Aprovechemos estas semanas entre Pascua y Pentecostés para hablar sobre los misterios de nuestra fe! La próxima semana daremos una mirada a la palabra "alma". ¿Qué significado tiene para nosotros esa palabra? ¡Tal vez usted quiera explorar esto en familia esta semana!

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we hear today is called “the story of Peter’s shadow.” “People carried the sick out into the streets and laid them on stretchers and bedrolls, hoping they would be touched by Peter’s shadow when he walked by, and they all were healed.” Beautiful statement! But did the healing power come from Peter? Obviously, no. Then, from whom? The Risen Lord. Why?

Who was Peter? He was one of Jesus’ apostles; the man who denied Jesus –not only once but three times; now he became the preacher of the Good News, of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Who were the apostles? They were the ones who ran away when Jesus was suffering and persecuted.

We see ourselves in the life of Peter and of the other apostles. Obviously, we are sinners. At the beginning of Mass, during the penitential rite, we say publicly *“I confess to Almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned through my own fault, in my thoughts and in my words...”* Strong and sincere statement! We recognize our sinfulness in what we have done and even in our thoughts. But we are saved by the Risen Lord! Further, we are called to serve Him. Through the sacrament of the Eucharist, we are commissioned to bring the Good News of the Risen Lord to other people. That is why the celebrant proclaims at the Mass dismissal *“Go in peace to serve the Lord and one another.”*

The mission of Peter and of the apostles continues with those who have good will. The mission is not reserved only to the priests and sisters as some people misunderstand. If the church belongs to all, then the mission of the church belongs to all. The Acts of the Apostle told us: *“They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people”* (2:46, 47) The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: *“The laity is made to share in the priestly, prophetic and kingly office of Christ; they have, therefore, in the Church and in the world, their own assignment in the mission of the whole People of God”* (CCC 873).

Every parish is blessed with the activities of many liturgical committees and apostolic movements. They play an important role in preaching the Good News to their neighbors and friends. **Faith is not limited to the boundaries of the church. Faith is at home, at shops, at the office. More than everything, faith is in the heart of each person.**

Yo “muero” a un estilo de vida - encerrarme en mí mismo - y me levanto a un diferente estilo de vida - abrirme para los demás. Este es el único camino para ser feliz. Este es también el tipo de dar del que Jesús estuvo hablando.

Si yo vivo este tipo de vida, yo heredaré mucha más vida que la que tuve antes.

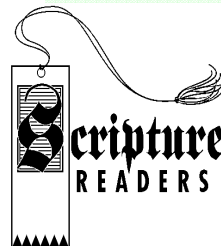
What is Goodness? One idea for the definition of goodness is "Constructively interacting to help fulfill or serve the purpose of other people so that they may become closer to God."

### Duties of a Catholic in My Neighborhood Brendan Rooks 4-5 Grade

I think it is very important to carry on the duties of a Catholic and to be an example of Christ. To fulfill my duties as a Catholic I should reflect Christ not only at home, but also in my neighborhood, as well as in the world in which we live. One duty we are called to as Catholics is to follow the Ten Commandments. Another duty that I think is important is to live as Jesus did. Finally, I think that being an ambassador for Christ and for all Catholics is a duty we are all called to live.

It is important to follow the Ten Commandments because God gave them to us. I can follow the Ten Commandments by going to Mass, by not using God's name in vain, and by honoring my father and my mother. When I follow the Ten Commandments, others in my neighborhood will see that I am a strong Catholic Christian.

To me, living as Jesus did means treating others the way I'd like to be treated. I can follow this duty by treating all people fairly and always including other people in my games. This responsibility requires us to think before we say something to other people. By living out this responsibility I can bring up a neighbor's newspaper or garbage can and I can also be mindful of the effect my words have on others.

Finally, I think it is my duty as a Catholic to be an ambassador of the Catholic faith I've been taught by my teachers and my parents. My role as an ambassador is to go out and share the good news that I have learned from my school, church, teachers, parents and friends. These are three good reasons that I know that help me to be good at carrying on the duties of a Catholic in my neighborhood and worldwide. In addition, I also get to learn more about my Catholic faith.
